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1 CALL TO ORDER

3 OLD BUSINESS

- a) Clayton Community Park Project
Presenter: Scott Barnard, Parks and Recreation Director

Mr. Barnard shared that the final walk through for the phase of construction located behind the Community Center has taken place. Areas to address were identified while others were deemed “wait and see”, but everything works and functions as designed

like the storm water retention pond, lights etc. The installation of the playground is coming soon as the equipment was delivered on Monday. The goal is to have the park completed by spring; other components like bocce and pickleball will be ready this winter. April 12 is set for the tentative ribbon-cutting to align with the Annual Plant Sale. Mr. Barnard explained that it was not unusual to have a ribbon-cutting after the official opening of a park. Mr. Barnard stated that we are very close to opening the amenities behind the Center.

b) Legend Park Project

Presenter: Scott Barnard, Parks and Recreation Director

Mr. Barnard restated that Legend Park is a mitigation site for the State due to its former use as a city dump site. Upon completion, the park will look like a meadow; no structures will be allowed on site due to the containment measures. Ideas for use will be limited, but it will continue to serve as a Greenway trailhead. Some surrounding acreage may be used for natural surface trails, nature-based play, and/or environmental education. Some dirt is ready to be moved in the next couple of weeks. The park/Greenway access near Legend Park will be closed for at least 13 months. The question was raised about a pedestrian crossing after the park is completed. It was determined that this would be a discussion for NCDOT.

c) Annual Board Tour

The Annual Board Tour took place in November and numerous sites around Town were visited and discussed. Mr. Barnard asked if there was any interest in another tour since we now have new Board members, and the last tour was lightly attended. At the mention of the Loop Road site, which was visited on the tour, a brief discussion ensued about sources for playground funding.

- e) Parks and Recreation Top CIP Projects

Mr. Barnard explained the CIP (Capital Improvement Plan) process. These projects require large funds. The Town's protocol begins with the 1) department's submission of needs list, 2) review and prioritization of needs by Town leadership, and 3) determination if funds are available to be allocated. Mr. Barnard encouraged Board members to take pictures of tangible ideas seen in other areas that would be great to see in our Town and send those ideas to him. This would be helpful in compiling a future needs list representative of citizen input.
